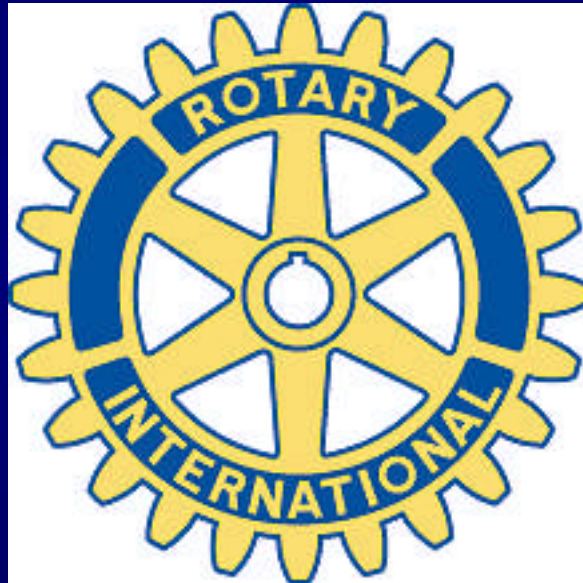

Rotary is an International Organization

- ⚙️ There are 530 districts in over 160 countries throughout the world.
- ⚙️ Our club, **Wahiawa-Waiialua** is in District 5000 which is comprised of 42 clubs with approximately 2,200 members.
- ⚙️ The district covers the Hawaiian islands.

Rotary International is governed by a president and a board of directors elected from all over the world.

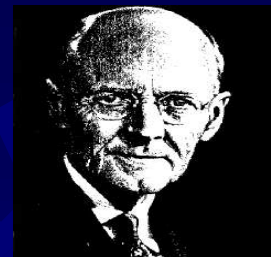

The first Rotary club was organized in Chicago in 1905, by Paul P. Harris.


The club, with four members, met in rotation at the offices of the members - thus the name Rotary.

There are approximately 1.2 million members in over 30,000 clubs worldwide.



Service Above Self

- ⚙️ Rotary was not long to recognize that fellowship alone would not keep a group together — there needed to be a purpose.
- ⚙️ The first service project was public restrooms in downtown Chicago, IL, USA.
- ⚙️ Rotary became the world's first service club.

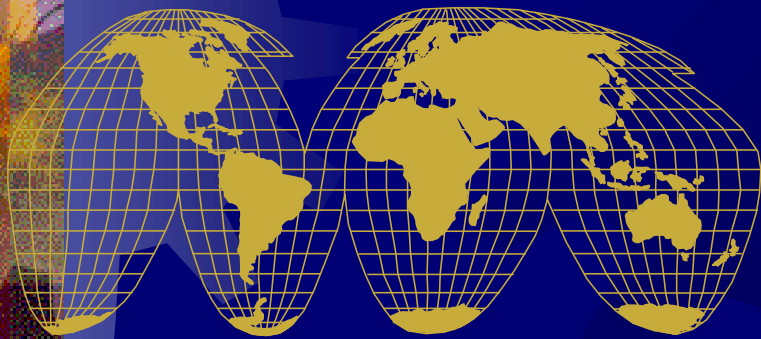

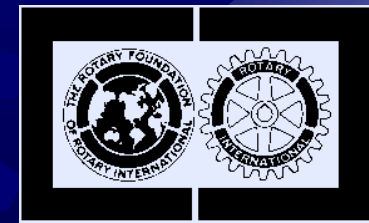

Group Study Exchanges

-  Teams of one Rotarian leader and four non-Rotarian business or professional young people visit the district for four to six weeks.
-  Wahaiawa-Waialua Rotarians have hosted visiting teams, been team leaders and sponsored team members.
-  Wahaiawa-Waialua is a major participant in the district's GSE program.

Rotary Youth Exchange Program

-  16-18 year olds are exchanged world-wide.
-  Part of a 7,000 students/year program.
-  Rotarians host these young people in their homes for three to five months.
-  Students become part of the family.
-  Wahiawa-Waialua has hosted students from Japan.
-  We have sent students to Japan.

- ❁ Fourth. The advancement of international understanding, good will, and peace through a world of fellowship of business and professional people united in the ideal of service.

- ⚙️ Attendance at the weekly meetings is a benefit of Rotary. A minimum of 60% is expected.
- ⚙️ You can easily maintain your attendance levels by making up at another Rotary club meeting, participating in club service projects, and activities.

Your Financial Obligations

- ☼ Initiation Fee **none**
- ☼ Annual Dues **\$160 /year**
- ☼ Meals **\$9.50 /week**
- ☼ Social Events **\$50 /year**
